What is the Vision of the ICCC?

The Council is an international, intercultural, interracial fellowship of churches and ministry centers which seeks to realize Christian unity in local, national, and world relations. The Council seeks fellowship, mutual support, and common ministries that reflect the unity of all who see themselves within the Christian tradition.

The Council seeks:

To be faithful to the prayer of Jesus Christ that "they may all be one;"
To witness to the inclusive love of God that overcomes all divisions;
To love and serve God, God's people, and God's creation;
To seek and share the truth;
To build toward a new world of peace;
To affirm individual freedom of conscience;
To affirm communities of justice, mercy, and love; and.
To be an integral partner in the worldwide ecumenical movement.

What Membership Offers your Church(es) or Center

Membership in the ICCC means your church(es) or center is part of a covenanted "community of churches". Our members are ecumenically minded with each being autonomous and allowed their own goverance (polity). Together they are committed to working and serving together in mission and minstry for reconciliation and justice.

In the ICCC we:

- + Gather in an Annual Conference for worship, Bible study, education, mission, business and fellowship.
 - + Offer opportunities for continuining education and theological formation.
 - + Have common mission projects and mission grants for local churches/centers.
 - + Offer access to pension and benefits for pastors and staff.
- + Provide a variety of resources including Lenten devotional, Community Church Sunday materials, Leadership Desk Calendar, search & call assisitance and other program and adminstration aids.
- + Are members of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA, World Council of Churches, Churches Uniting in Christ and Christian Churches Together.

Financial Commitment to the ICCC

Part of being in covenant with the ICCC, means that all churches and centers have a responsibility to share their gifts with the whole of the ICCC. Whether it be sharing ministry resources and ideas through networking, offering persons for our leadership, participation in goverance at Annual Conerence, and financial gifts to support our ongoing ministry, you are an important covenant partner.

As with any organization, the life and vitality of the ICCC can only be as strong as the treasure, time and talent given by its members. As the ICCC seeks to be valuable and relevant in service to our churches and centers, it must rely totally on financial contributions to carry out our various programs and services. An annual donation is required to remain in covenant with the ICCC as an active member.

How Does My Church(es) or Center Become a Member?

This is how you covenant with us and become a member of the ICCC:

1.	According to your goverance structure, have your membership or a governing body endorse the principles contained in the ICCC constitution, by approving a resolution stating:			
	Whereas, is committed to the ministry of reconciliation in church and society, and belives in congregational automony, freedom of conscience and the conciliar ideal: We vote to join in covenant and become a member of the International Council of Community Churches on this date			
	A copy of the minutes of the meeting where this resolution is approved should be enclosed with your application.			
2.	Complete the Member Application.			
3.	Send a copy of your your 501c3 designation. We also request a copy of your church(es)			

4. Agree to participate in the ministry and mission of the ICCC, by sending voting delegates and other representatives to Annual Conference, and offering other leadership for the ICCC's continuing work.

5. Send an initial financial contribution for the ICCC's general ministry, and promise to be faithful in your financial stewardship in the future.

At the first Annual Conference following membership, the conference registraion fee will be waived for one member of the clergy and one lay person.
